It is fair to say that **Geoff Dyer** has a bit of a thing about Tasmania. The Wynne nine-time finalist and serial Archibald star has been painting the landscape of the Apple Isle for a long time, capturing both its lush green beauty and its barren extremes with a deft hand. The state's native son revisits familiar haunts such as the area around Hobart, Bass Strait, coastal landscapes and more in *Recent Tasmanian Landscapes*.
